How to achieve the objectives? -1

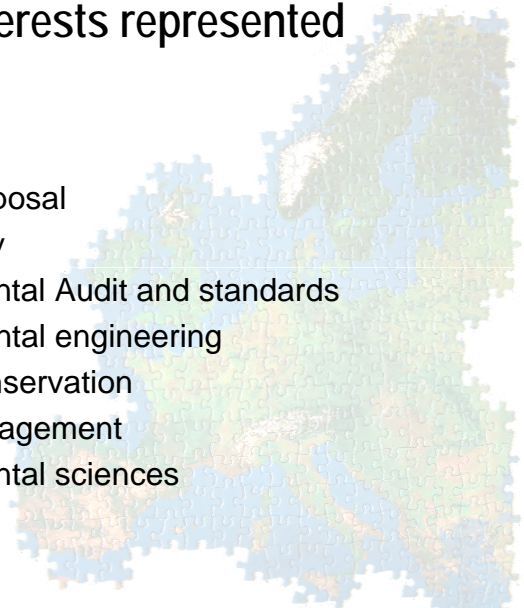
- contributing to the development of environmental policy within the EU and other appropriate bodies;

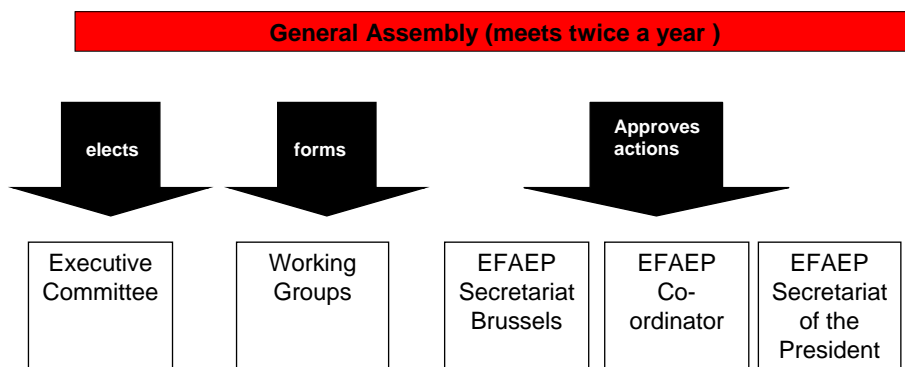
